IN NAACP: Climate and Environmental Justice Hub

IN NAACP centralizes energy democracy in their electric vehicle infrastructure organizing and solar initiatives to address. They engage in coalitions and alliances to ensure any NEVI dollars are equitably distributed and hold government agencies through press releases, events, and media coverage.



GPAS used the Energy Democracy Scorecard with the Buffalo Rebellion Network to build shared language and analysis on energy and impacts on Indigenous communities.



KWEA used the Energy Democracy Scorecard to understand more deeply their fight of energy equity by incorporating the principles and pillars of energy democracy into community education opportunities and funding opportunities. As their first funding, they have been able to leverage engagement in this program to receive much-needed additional funding.



HPC3 incorporates energy democracy into all of their work including the **Blueprint for Energy Democracy**. ECC was a thought partner and sounding board for projects and grant opportunities.



RGISC has organized and educated many community members of the Justice40 Initiative and used the Energy Democracy Scorecard with their wider coalitions, leading to a greater understanding of Energy Democracy. With the support of ECC, they hosted a **Justice40 Symposium Summit**.

Hijra House

Hijra House incorporated the lens of energy democracy into grant and network proposals resulting in new networks and increased access to funding resources.



LCEA is at the forefront of the energy democracy movement in the Bay Area, fighting for decentralized, just energy systems that work for all.



HRC looks at how energy democracy and the Scorecard can be framed around the carceral system and abolition.



SPI used the Energy Democracy Scorecard with the LEAP LA Coalition to build a shared language and analysis of energy systems and their impact on Indigenous communities. A relationship was formed with the ECC SoCal regional office.
